

# Day Programs

We offer different Day Programs that vary in content and program choice and may depend on the individual's developmental or emotional needs, as well as personal preference. All programs are guided by a person-centered philosophy and are designed to promote community inclusion and well-being, in addition to vocational training when desired.

The programs are staffed by trained interventionists and educators with the additional support of behavioral health clinicians, occupational therapists, speech/language therapists, music therapists, nurses, activity coordinators and vocational specialists. Funding and referral processes differ based on the program.

### Partial Hospitalization (Monday-Friday between 8 am – 3 pm) Minimum 3 hours a day.

This is a short-term, structured psychiatric stabilization program that employs multiple mental health interventions and is designed to serve adults with emotional needs. An initial medical or behavioral health evaluation will determine whether you need the Partial Hospitalization Service.

### Transitions (Monday-Friday 8 am – 3 pm)

This is a structured adult day support program that emphasizes preparation for community employment opportunities. Designed to serve individuals with disabilities, their schedule and length of stay are person-centered and individually determined.

### Day Treatment (Monday-Friday 8 am – 3 pm)

This is a structured adult day support program that is designed to serve adults with disabilities and behavioral needs. Activities support personal interests and preferences.

### Community Living (Monday-Friday 8 am – 3pm)

This is an adult day support program for individuals with disabilities who may prefer an activities-based program designed to promote community inclusion, independence, well-being and emphasize vocational training when desired.

### Alternative Education (Monday-Friday 9 am – 2pm)

This educational program is designed for school-aged children with an I.E.P. whose behavior or developmental needs require more support than is typical for their local school district's classrooms. Referrals come through the individual's school district.

### Employment First Initiative

As the initial step of person-centered planning, our Employment First Coordinator determines the individual's employment classification. The Day Programs meets each individual where they are on their "path to employment" and offers community experiences, vocational training, supported employment and competitive employment opportunities.

### Non-Medical Transportation

This service provides transport to and from work or to and from Day Programs, Monday-Friday. The Blick Center has a fleet of seven 10-12 passenger vans operated by experienced Day Programs staff.
